Project Overview

What have we looked at?

• CRSL: 'litigation that seeks to bring about **positive legal and/or social change** in terms of children's enjoyment of their rights'

Why?

- Huge **increase** in CRSL over last two decades with growing range of actors bringing cases in different legal contexts
- urgent need to consider (and critique) the practice and impact of CRSL from a child rights perspective

Who are we?

• 8 global partners drawn from academia and advocacy (at the moment!)



Key Aims of the Project

- To strengthen the capacity of CRSL litigation to deliver on children's rights globally through
 - expanding academic engagement with CRSL
 - bringing a number of key CRSL cases before judicial and quasi-judicial bodies
 - engaging effectively with the challenges and opportunities presented by CRSL not only for children, but also with them
- Key elements of the project
 - 1. The **mapping of** existing CRSL practice and development of a CRSL **network**
 - 2. To develop a **model of** *child rights-compliant* CRSL
 - to provide resources for different parties involved in CRSL to support child rights-compliant practice particular emphasis on child co-produced and child-oriented materials
 - 3. To develop and support concrete CRSL efforts in a number of thematic areas
 - migration
 - the recommendations of the UN Global Study on Children Deprived of Liberty
 - climate change
